

The Rules of the Roundtable are simple:

1. **No numbers**. We do not discuss attendance and offering numbers. This rule makes the discussion encouraging to every pastor.



- 2. **No superiors**. We are all equal at the table; no one is superior or inferior to another. It is refreshing to be with men who actually practice genuine humility!
- 3. **No theology**. Unless it is agreed beforehand that we can discuss a theological preference without it affecting our friendships, we avoid the issues we disagree on. There are so many other things we can talk about!
- 4. **Quick meal prayers**. We assume you are spending sufficient time with God in your life. These are not prayer meetings (although we do share prayer requests at times). So, when the food arrives, short prayers only. We like hot food!
